<u>Kiingi Tūheitia Põtatau Te Wherowhero VII</u>

On Friday 30th August Kiingi Tūheitia Pōtatau Te Wherowhero VII passed away at the age of 69. He reigned as our Māori King for 18 years. He was the seventh in line of Pootatau Te Wherowhero to head the Kiingitanga, which was founded in 1858. Iwi from across Actearca travelled to pay their respects at Turangawaewae Marae where he was acknowledged, remembered and showered with love and admiration. He was instrumental in connecting Maoridom to the world, for his drive for kotahitanga, and for his passion of creating better futures for Māori. On Monday afternoon I travelled up so I could attend the 8am powhiri on Tuesday alongside the Tumuaki from Cloverlea School and Manchester Street School. We took our love and support from our schools and communities to his wife, his children, his family, his iwi, and to all those who made it possible for the thousands of people who attended the 13 powhiri (x2 a day, at 8am and 2pm) for 7 days. It was absolutely incredible to see and feel the level of whanaungatanga, manaakitanga, and kaitiakitanga there. Below is a picture of the people gathering to enter the marae, and the flags that fly inside the marae.

Kiingi Tūheitia's youngest child and only daughter has been named as the eighth Māori monarch in a ceremony at Turangawaewae yesterday.
