This journey confirmed that the tikanga we have at our kura around cultural competence and practice is sound and ensures that our tamariki and whānau truly have and feel a sense of belonging and the mauri (life force) that comes with this.



Before I went overseas I took a pounamu around to each class so they could hold this taonga and transfer their mauir into this. I placed this taonga on the marae at Taputapuatea - Raiatea."
