While this was occurring the tamariki were chanting our newly learnt chant and cheering us on. Then in the afternoon we all worked together in our teams having relays and building towers with various items. This was a lot of fun and also provided another opportunity for us to sing our chants. What a fabulous Friday we all had.
